In construction, a controller manages financial aspects, reviewing and compiling financial documents, and may also oversee document control like blueprint and report management

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- ✓ Manage and oversee financial operations, including accounts payable and receivable, payroll, and general ledger accounting
- ✓ Develop and monitor budgets, forecasts, and financial statements
- ✓ Prepare and analyze financial reports for senior management and other stakeholders
- ✓ Manage cash flow and investment activities
- ✓ Coordinate and manage external audits and tax filings
- ✓ Provide guidance and support to project managers and other stakeholders on financial matters
- ✓ Monitor and report on project progress, including cost and schedule
